

2019 Gala Honorees

Mother Dolores Hart, O.S.B. was the recipient of the 2019 **Pope Leo XIII Award**. Before entering Regina Laudis Abbey in Bethlehem CT, she was a well-known Hollywood actress. At the height of her career she followed the call of Christ, left all behind and became a member of the Benedictine community. Her amazing journey is documented in the book she wrote, "Ear of the Heart." A copy of the book was a gift to each person who attended the Gala.

The Saint Raphael Award is awarded each year to a Catholic man or woman who demonstrates adherence to their Catholic faith and who is distinguished in their chosen profession. Chosen to receive the award this year was Mr. John Allen, a well-known journalist, and currently the editor of CRUX, an independent Catholic news site. Highly respected for indispensable writing, he is quoted as being possibly the "best source of Vatican information published in the U.S." As a youth Mr. Allen grew up in Hays, Kansas and some of his teachers there in the city had been the Sisters of Saint Agnes, one of whom attended the Gala and met him. That was S. Doris Klein, CSA and he spoke with S. Mary Alice Walters who was unable to attend because of illness via a cell phone call to her home in Milwaukee WI.

Military service is a requirement for all young men in Switzerland, and after he served that compulsory term he applied for entry into another, the oldest and smallest army in the world—The Swiss Guard in Vatican City!

He qualified because he is a Swiss citizen and served for 28 months; longer than minimum term of 26 months. After rigorous training, he worked as a Guard doing sentry duty, ceremonial rituals, and working to keep the Vatican properties and the Pope's life safe.

He continues to be a member of the

Vatican running club, made up of running enthusiasts currently and previously employed by the Vatican. The team includes women, men, religious, lay, nuns and priests.
