ince January 2022, The Leo House was saddened by the loss of a Board Member and of two Friends who by word and deed considered The Leo House their 'home away from home'.




Francis D. Coleman—Leo House, Board of Directors


Rev. Rinaldo Damian—Friend of The Leo House

Father Rinaldo Damian was from the State of Massachusetts and before his ordination in 1988, he had obtained a bachelor's and Master's degree in music from the New England Conservatory of Music. After ordination he received an additional Master's and Doctorate in Liturgical Music from the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. He served as an Associate pastor in MA and in 1977 began part-time work for the Military Ordinariate as a Catholic chaplain in the VA Medical Centers of both Providence RI, and of Miami FL. On retirement he returned to the Diocese of Worchester MA. Father Damian traveled frequently to New York for piano/music classes at Julliard. His home away from home was **The Leo House** and he acquired many friends among the staff while here. He is greatly missed.



Rev. George F. Riley O.S.A. — Friend of The Leo House

According to the homilist at Father Riley's funeral service, "he loved being an Augustinian priest, and the Augustinians loved him." After his ordination in 1962, Fr. Riley was assigned to Villanova University as a student, then as an instructor. He also served his community and Villanova as an administrator. Of special note was his work with Alumni Relations and work on various fund-raising campaigns. He was gregarious, friends to



everyone, and possessed an outstanding sense of humor. When work took him to New York, *The Leo House* was always his home, and for 50 years he ministered each weekend to various parishes on the South Jersey Shore. In recognition for his 60 years of service to Villanova, the Augustinians re-named its health care fund to "The George F. Riley O.S.A. Fund for Augustinian Healthcare." Sadly, he passed away on Sept. 16, 2022.
